Task 1: Winning the Lottery

Activity 1: Listening

Welcome to a practice listening for the ISE 1, listening task 1.

You are going to hear a talk about winning the lottery. You will hear the talk twice. As you listen, write down some notes about what you hear, if you want to. I will ask you six questions on some facts about winning the lottery. Are you ready?

Audio Script

Have you ever thought [Present Perfect] about winning the lottery? I know I was dreaming [Past continuous] about winning more times than I can remember. However, why do people play when there is such a small chance of winning the lottery? Well, some people have to [Semi-modal verb: have to] play since it becomes a habit. They often pick a series of numbers and it becomes a weekly routine for them, like going to the supermarket. Another reason is because [Connector] the lottery is usually not too expensive, so it's not really difficult to invest a little money to help your dream of winning come true. Also, when people play the lottery, they often become excited [Zero Conditional] with the thought that they could win so much money with just investing a little bit of money. Also, if the jackpot starts going up, there will surely be [first conditional / will for future use and possibilities] a lot [Adverbs of Quantity] more people playing than usual because of [Connector] the excitement of winning so much money and they all need to [Semi-modal verb: need to] be a part of this trend. However, the number one reason why people must [modal verb: must] play the lottery is because they fantasize of becoming rich in order to [Infinitive of Purpose] live a better life than they do in their present life. The largest lottery winning was \$1,586 billion in the Powerball Jackpot in January 2016 and was split between three people. What would you do with so much money? Would you rather [Preferences] spend it all on yourself or might [Modal verb: might] you share it with the people that you care about?
