Audio Script

Spain is a popular travel destination, and has been called more than once the Carribean of Europe. However, you **must** take into account that tourism and vacation has changed a lot from past to present.

In that past, there wasn't a lot of travelling out of Spain. So, one point to consider is that Spaniards mainly took their vacations in August. However, if you had a lower position in the workforce, this perhaps was not your luck. You **may** not be given the choice but to take your vacation in July. Another thing to think about is that since everybody went in the same time frame, prices were often inflated in house and apartment rentals, **which** could make it very expensive and it was very normal for extended family to rent one place and multiple family units all go at the same time so that they could enjoy a longer vacation period. Furthermore, since the majority of the people would take their summer break at the same time, it was very common for vacation spots to be overcrowded. **If you were to go to a restaurant or the beach, you would have to** go early enough to claim a place since there were so many people. Also, Spaniards **used to** go on vacation more within Spain than out of their country, because it was more expensive and there was less air transportation available.

Now, turning to the present, we can see that there has been changes when concerning Spaniards going on vacation. When comparing with the past, it **ought to** be noted that vacation periods are extended anywhere from June to October. Although, it remains true that the most popular times are in July and August. In addition, even though many people still rent houses, apartments and hotels, more vacation homes **are owned** by people these days. Notwithstanding these changes, the inflated prices of July and August are still there but with the use of the internet these days, somebody that is willing to do the research and hunt for an offer, can find a great price. An added perk for those that love to find good deals is that you **should** be able to see at the end of august sales on beach and summer clothing. Something else that is seen these days is that with more affordable international travel, more Spaniards are taking their holidays out of Spain.
