Trick-or-treating can be a lot of fun. However, there are some basic rules that need to be followed. Before going trick-or-treating, make sure that everybody uses the bathroom. That way nobody will have to when they are asking for candy. Another rule is to make sure that adults and children stay together. There are a lot of people out, so it can be easy for a child to get lost. Also, if the children are young, go trick-or-treating nearby, because the child could get tired if you go far away. Something else to think about is that the weather changes and the later it gets, the colder it can get. For this reason it is a good idea to dress in layers or bring a coat. Something else that is a good idea is to go trick-or-treating in groups of parents and children. That way more parents are watching the children and the children are having fun with their friends. Finally, children should never eat any candy or chocolate before they get home. Parents should check the candy and chocolate first, and throw away any that have open wrappers. If trick-or-treaters follow these rules, they will have a safe and fun Halloween!

1	What should you do before going trick-or-treating?	Use the bathroom
2	Why should adults and children stay together?	A child could get lost
3	Where should you go trick-or-treating if the child is young?	Nearby
4	Because the weather changes, what should trick-or-treaters do?	Dress in layers / bring a coat



5	Why should parents and children go trick-or-treating in groups?	more parents watch the children / children have fun with friends
6	Why shouldn't children eat any candy or chocolate before getting home?	Parents should throw away any with open wrappers
