By having more trees cut down and not replaced, we also have less oxygen created in the world. Although there are many other environmental concerns, water pollution is also one that ought to not be ignored. Most of the time this is caused by human activity. This can harm the aquatic ecosystem and any lifesource that depends on the water source. If sea life had been affected before it has been captured as a food source, then it can well harm the health of those that consume it. If we are not careful this could wipe out many species in the oceans and rivers.

Despite all these problems, they are not without solutions. For instance, with different sorts of transports, as their energy source is replaced with alternatives sources, like solar, wind or geothermal. You must consider that this will help keep the air clean. When it comes to deforestation, there are also some aspects that the government should take an active role in. If the government were to ban clear-cutting forest, then it would keep a total depletion of a forest from happening, which is quite practical. Reforestation for cut trees is just as important to make sure that cut trees are being replaced and as a result we look after the world's oxygen source. Furthermore, as for water pollution, many factories that could contaminate the water, may be persuaded to not do so by the large fines that the government places over such acts. It might also be a good idea to have programmed testing of water sources, especially for areas that are used for fishing. Citizens can also do their part by not throwing litter into water sources, like rivers and beaches. If people had been aware of the harm that this does, they would have been more careful with their litter and throw it away in the designated waste bins.

Through reports of effects on the earth, we have been seeing that we are progressing in our efforts, but we still have a way to go and have to face up to all the environmental problems that have been caused by humans.
